RECOMMENDED:-

1. That the Committee recognised the unfortunate situation in terms of how the process had been managed but moved to support the approval of the additional basic need funding to temporarily expand

Henlow Church of England Academy in order to accommodate the additional 2017 and 2018 cohorts.

- 2. That a detailed report be delivered to the Committee in January 2018 comprehensively outlining the reasons behind the breakdown in process management, with a detailed action plan in order to mitigate similar instances in the future.
