# **Purpose of this report**

To report on the Statutory Consultation to install No Waiting at Any Time at the junction with Graham Road and Oakwood Avenue, Dunstable.

#### Issues

# **Background Information**

- Graham Road was recently made One Way, from Southwood Road to Oakwood Road.
  This was approved at a previous TM meeting and works completed on site in
  November 2018.
- 3. Throughout the several stages; scoping of the design, the design being completed and then build on site, conditions changed slightly that affected the desired result of the constructed scheme.
- 4. Since the scheme has been in operation it has become apparent there have been conflicts between vehicles at this junction, caused by vehicles parking at the Oakwood and Graham Road junction where works took place. This has led to limited or no visibility of this junction and the new layout.

### **Scheme Proposal**

5. To rectify a safety issue caused by parked cars at the junction and create an adequate visibility splay, No Waiting at Any Time has been proposed and implemented on site, with the TRO to be addressed retrospectively.

# **Statutory Consultation**

6. Statutory Consultation took place in February for 21 days with all Statutory bodies consulted. Notices were displayed on site and copies posted to residents.

#### **Options for consideration**

- 7. One or two residents may be affected; however the proposals are brought on safety grounds. Even though the restrictions have been installed the intention was to review the lengths (reduce) should comments be received concerning this, before sealing the TRO and on-site enforcement.
- 8. No comments have been received by residents or others. The Police raised no objections or comments, therefore the length of the restrictions do not need to be reviewed.

## Reason for urgency

- 9. The proposals are brought on safety grounds the, site has been marked however the TRO will need sealing before any enforcement of the site takes place.
- 10. The proposal are also brought to meet the Traffic Management Act 2004 and ensure the free movement of traffic.

#### **Council Priorities**

11. The proposals meet objective J of the Local Transport Plan- reduce the risk of people being killed or seriously injured.

13. The TRO will need sealing before enforcement on site.

#### Reason for proposal:

The waiting restrictions are intended to address indiscriminate parking and to ensure that junctions are not obstructed by parked vehicles.

#### Effect of the Order:

#### To introduce No Waiting at any time on the following lengths of road in Dunstable:-

- Oakwood Avenue, southeast side, from a point in line with the western boundary of Nos. 78/80
   Oakwood Avenue, extending in a westerly direction and around the junction for approximately
   15.7m into Graham road, tying in with the outside of the northern boundary of Nos. 78/80 Oakwood
   Avenue
- Oakwood Avenue, southeast side, from a point in line with the eastern boundary of Nos. 70/72
   Oakwood Avenue, extending in a westerly direction and around the junction for approximately
   24.5m into Graham road, tying in with the opposite of the northern boundary of Nos. 78/80
   Oakwood Avenue
