•We as members of the CiCC continue to meet on a monthly basis to work through our priorities and continue to promote the work of the CiCC.



•We attended a CiCC open day where we took part in team building exercises and recruited more young people to the CiCC. We currently have 14 members who attend the monthly meetings.

•We will be organising another CiCC open day to recruit and develop a CiCC for younger children and young people.

•Members of the CiCC also attended the Foster Carer Awards to promote the work of the CiCC as well as help with the presentation of awards.

•A survey will be sent out to all Looked After Children and Care Leavers – once this has been completed the information will be used to agree the CiCC priorities and work plan.


•The Pledge was launched in 2009 and as part of the survey we will be asking children and young people for their feedback.
