Houghton Regis

A response was given by the Town Council as there was no opportunity for comment by the TCMC within the consultation period. A response from the TCMC will be gathered before the Executive meeting in November.

Generally concerns are expressed over the complexity of the proposed set up. The proposal appears to be trying to establish one 'process for supporting town centre development' to fit all town centres. As previously discussed the Town Centres in Central Bedfordshire are all very different and require an individual approach to their management & development.

The proposal introduces another set of development plans and action plans and puts considerable onus on town councils to undertake this additional work. There appears to be little regards to the capacity of town councils to undertake this additional works.

Appendix A lists proposed economic indicators for town centres. Bids for funding would be assessed against these indicators and concern is expressed that smaller towns like Houghton Regis would not be on an equal footing and funding may repeatedly go to the same areas

The indicators were considered vague and concern was expressed over the possibility of gathering accurate and comparable information, especially if collected by individual Town Councils.

Para 5.3 suggests that with Town Centre Groups not being within the constitution this would allow for maximum flexibility but it was not understood why this would be the case. It was suggested that inclusion in the constitution would ensure a firm commitment from Central Bedfordshire to Town Centres.

Within the Central Bedfordshire Executive Committee making the funding decisions it was felt that decisions would be further moved away from the local community. In the long term it was felt that this would not be sustainable. Concern was expressed that those making the decisions would not understand or fully appreciate local issues and priorities. The list of proposed membership of Town Centre Partnerships does not have enough local involvement.

It was generally felt that whilst the Town Council was keen to work in partnership with Central Bedfordshire on matters of common interest including economic development there was general opposition to the proposal.

Leighton Linslade

67/LL CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL CONSULTATION – THE WAY FORWARD

The Committee received a Central Bedfordshire Officer report which outlined the proposals relating to town centres within the new Central Bedfordshire Council area that was due to be put before the Central Bedfordshire Executive in the autumn of 2009.

Members noted that under the previous local authority arrangements the Parish of Leighton-Linslade had the services of a Town Centre Manager and that an annual budget in the region of £37,000 had been allocated to the Town Centres Management Committee. The Committee noted that the post of Leighton Buzzard and Linslade Town Centres Manager no longer existed within the new Central Bedfordshire Authority. It was acknowledged that Central Bedfordshire had, as gesture of goodwill, agreed the revenue funding for 2009/10 on the understanding that consultation would take place throughout the year to introduce a process that allowed for output focused town centre development across the whole of Central Bedfordshire. The Committee was further informed that previous capital funding allocated to Leighton Buzzard and Linslade Town Management Committee, a sum in the region of £180,000, had been reallocated to Central Reserves.

The Committee noted that the new Central Bedfordshire Authority sought parity of treatment and approach for all towns within its area. Hence the consultation provided a new process for all towns within Central Bedfordshire. It was accepted that whilst support would be provided by Central Bedfordshire Officers, Town Councils would be responsible for their own Operational Action Plan, Town Centre & Retail Development Plan and substantiated bids for economic development funding and other grants from the new Central Bedfordshire Authority.

A wide ranging discussion took place which celebrated the past work of the Town Centre Management Committee which had been achieved with the officer and financial support of South Bedfordshire District Council. Members noted that the consultation paper was about process not funding but they expressed the view that guaranteed future funding was essential for the Committee to operate effectively and successfully.

RESOLVED that the Central Bedfordshire Executive reject the proposed policy document "Process for supporting Town Centre Development" and that the working partnership between Central Bedfordshire and the Leighton-Linslade Town Centre Management Committee operate in the same way as the previous partnership working with South Bedfordshire District Council – with specific reference to guaranteed annual funding and specific Officer support.
