Introduction

- 1. This report informs Members of recommended proposed changes to the Planning Code of Good Practice and the Code for Site Visits. The Local Government Association recently revised its advice on these areas in its publication "Probity in Planning" and officers have revisited the Council's Constitution in so far as it is affected by the advice.
- 2. Existing local guidance is contained in Part 2 of the Central Bedfordshire Ethical Handbook and was based on the previous codes operated by the three legacy authorities. The intention is to provide clear simple and proportionate guidance for Members dealing with planning issues.

Changes

- 3. Attached at Appendix "A" to this report are the Codes which detail the suggested amendments in italic text.
- 4. In summary the changes reflect the LGA advice which adds more flexibility for Members to become involved in pre-application discussions.
- 5. The proposed changes were considered by Development Management Committee on 20 January which resolved to refer the amended Code to Standards Committee for consideration and adoption by Council.

Conclusion and Next Steps

6. Subject to Standards Committee accepting the proposed changes the Code will be recommended to Council for adoption.
