Part 2 – Expansion of Sunnyside Community Special School and merger with Hitchmead Foundation Special School

Notice is given in accordance with section 19(1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that Central Bedfordshire Council intends to make a prescribed alteration to Sunnyside Community Special School, The Baulk, Biggleswade, Beds, SG18 0PT from 01 September 2010 to create an area Special School for pupils with complex needs aged 3-19 across the existing Sunnyside and Hitchmead school sites.

Explanatory Notes

There will be no displaced pupils as a result of this proposal as it is intended that the merged school will continue to occupy both the existing Hitchmead and Sunnyside school buildings, therefore an increase in capacity is not required at Sunnyside.

It is proposed that merging Hitchmead with Sunnyside will provide improved continuity for all pupils, including provision up to age 19 for Hitchmead pupils if required (current age range is 7-16). Access to more space and resources, including specialist staff and access to satellite provision in mainstream schools have also been identified as additional benefits for all pupils.
