Appendix B

Response to the Consultation on School Funding 2011/12 : Introducing a Pupil Premium

Consultation launched on 26th July, a further review of school funding which seeks views on the arrangements for the operation of a Pupil Premium and the distribution of the DSG for 2011-12. The consultation closes on the 18th October and is closely linked with Comprehensive Spending Review 20th October.

10 Questions were asked under two broad headings

Pupil Premium for disadvantaged pupils

1. Do you agree it is right to give a higher pupil premium to areas that currently receive less per pupil funding

Yes but maintaining current levels of DSG and not a cut.

2. What is your preferred deprivation indicator for allocating the pupil premium

Attention must be drawn to the limitations of FSM, with a large percentage of children that take sandwiches to school, when they could qualify for FSM but don't claim because of stigma. Parents do not realise that by not claiming they are damaging school's funding.

However Ever FSM does address the problem of pupils who move in and out of eligibility. However primary schools would be disadvantaged where there is no previous history to use. It helps secondary schools where it is known that take up of FSM diminishes with age.

3. Do you agree the coverage of the pupil premium should include Looked After Children

Yes but money should go to LA for distribution as appropriate.

4. What are your views on the operation of the Looked After Children element of the pupil premium? In particular, how might the funding arrangements work at local authority level for pupils educated outside of the local authority with caring responsibility?

Difficult to answer this one

5. Do you think the coverage of the pupil premium should be extended to include additional support for Service Children?
