

Dear Central Bedfordshire Council

roposed changes to 14A Woburn Street, Ampthill by Mr Duzgun Yilmaz

We refer to the proposal by Mr Duzgun Yilmaz to open the property at 14A Woburn Street from 23:00 until midnight from Sunday through to Thursday, and from 23:00 until 02:00 on Friday and Saturday. It appears the intention is to serve 'late night refreshments'. We wish to make our opposition to this proposal very clear: Woburn Street is currently home to many families, including those with young children, as well as a good number of elderly people. Ampthill itself is a small market town with only a very few pubs operating later into the evening. We see no need for Woburn Street – or any other street in Ampthill for that matter – to become home to a business serving 'refreshments' into the very late hours.

The inevitable result of these opening hours would be an increase in noise levels to residents, anti-social behaviour, and vandalism. If you wonder how we can be so certain of this outcome, then you only have to witness the anti-social behaviour that takes place when customers take a slow leave from the Queen's Head pub. As the landlord has himself admitted, he cannot encourage groups of leaving drinkers to leave his premises in an orderly manner, and the results are late-night disturbances, including shouting, swearing, and dangerous mess such as discarded broken glasses and smashed beer bottles. Vandalism to parked cars is also a recurring issue.

instead of granting a licence to Mr Yilmaz, and exacerbating the issue of late night anti-social behaviour, we would like to see the Council refuse the application and encourage the likes of the Queen's Head pub to control its customers. Ampthill is currently a pleasant town with some instances of late-night disturbances. A business serving refreshments until as late as 02.00 in the morning will quickly result in further issues for its residents.
