- 8. Councils work in a variety of ways to drive forward improvements in the educational achievements of the children they look after. In Central Bedfordshire this is managed through the work of the Virtual School for Looked After Children.
- 9. The Virtual School:
 - ensures that there is a system to track and monitor the attainment and progress of looked after children;
 - ensures that all looked after children have a robust and effective personal education plan;
 - works with schools to improve overall attainment by maximising the achievement and progress of individual children;
 - works with social workers to improve access and attainment of Looked After Children;
 - supports Looked After Children placed outside of Central Bedfordshire Council boundaries.
- 10. The Annual Report contains the early outcomes for looked after children for the academic year 2010-2011. These results are provisional. National and statistical neighbour information is not yet available. It is therefore proposed that in future the annual report comes to the Corporate Parenting Panel in January each year to ensure that all data has been collected from schools and that comparative data is available.
