6.1 Terms of Reference

- 6.1.1 To make arrangements for the appointment of the Head of Paid Service, Directors, Assistant Chief Executives, Chief Finance Officer and Monitoring Officer and the dismissal of the Head of Paid Service, via the Appointments Sub-Committee;
- 6.1.2 To determine strategic employee policies;
- 6.1.3 To determine terms and conditions of employment for employees;

6.1.4 To consider any matter referred by the Employee Partnership Committee;

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6.1.5 To consider and determine any matter relating to HR policies or terms or conditions of employment referred from the Joint Consulting and Negotiating Forum in circumstances where it has not been possible to reach agreement between staff and management sides on such matters;

Note: The Joint Consulting and Negotiating Forum is an informal group comprising the Portfolio holder for Children's Services, the Director of Children's Services and representatives of 7 professional associations for primary and secondary education.

- 6.1.6 To exercise the Council's functions under Chapter 7 (sections 26 to 37) of the Localism Act relating to ethical standards
- 6.1.7 To carry out all functions relating to elections, electoral registration, changing governance arrangements and community governance reviews (specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to the Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) Regulations 2000 as may be amended from time to time);
- 6.1.8 To deal with matters relating to the civic and ceremonial activities of the Council;
- 6.1.9 To consider all matters relating to the name and status of the area and individuals;
- 6.1.10 Oversight of the Council's Constitution, including approving any changes that may be required on the advice of the Monitoring Officer;
- 6.1.11. To deal with all other non-Executive functions which are not reserved to the full Council or are not otherwise delegated.

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6.2 Limitation of Powers

The Committee will have full delegated powers subject to the following exceptions which shall be recommended for full Council approval:-

6.2.1 The approval of any proposal to change the name of the Council or a Parish;

- 6.2.2 The approval of any recommendations arising from the conduct of a community governance review under Section 86 of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007;
- 6.2.3 The power to petition for a charter to confer borough status;
- 6.2.4 Proposals for submission to the Boundary Committee for England in respect of:-
 - 6.2.4.1 Electoral arrangements for the District and those Parishes within Central Bedfordshire; and
 - 6.2.4.2 Parliamentary Constituencies within Bedfordshire.
