**Background and Information**

1. A petition has been received, signed by 35 people, requesting the Council to move the national speed limit signs on the A6 at the junction of Old Silsoe Road to the beginning of the dual carriageway. Supporting documents state that this would deter drivers from accelerating at a vulnerable junction where several accidents have already occurred.
2. The existing 40mph speed limit on the A6 through Clophill terminates approximately 80 metres south of the A507 roundabout. This means that the junction of Old Silsoe Road and the frontage of the filling station are currently outside of the 40mph speed limit. There appears to be some merit in lowering the speed limit on this length of road, which may result in some road safety benefits.
3. However, the request needs to be properly assessed, taking into account the collision history, characteristics of the road, current traffic speeds, suitable sign locations and initial police consultation. It is recommended that this assessment be undertaken in conjunction with other speed limit requests during the 2017/18 financial year.
